For those who knew him, I am sure that you would all agree. Kevin was a man with great spirit and enthusiasm. Always smiling, and with kind words.

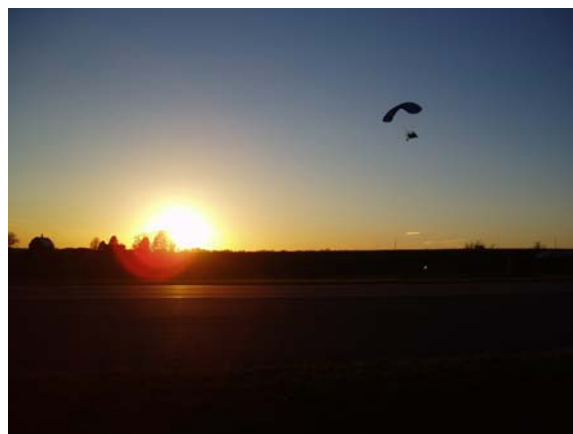


Kevin will certainly be remembered often. But especially when a
